Luke 5.15-16 (NIV11)

Yet the news about him spread all the more, so that crowds of people came to hear him and to be healed of their sicknesses. But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed.

Luke 6.12 (NIV11)

One of those days Jesus went out to a mountainside to pray, and spent the night praying to God.

Luke 9.28-29, 34-36 (NIV11)

About eight days after Jesus said this, he took Peter, John and James with him and went up onto a mountain to pray. As he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning.....

While he was speaking, a cloud appeared and covered them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. A voice came from the cloud, saying, “This is my Son, whom I have chosen; listen to him.” When the voice had spoken, they found that Jesus was alone.

Luke 11.1-2 (NIV)

One day Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he finished, one of his disciples said to him, “Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.” He said to them, “When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name...”

Luke 11.2-4 (NIV11)

1John 3.1 (NIV11)

See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!

1John 4.9 (NIV11)

This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him.

See God as Father – who takes
care of us

Psalm 103.13 (NIV11)

As a father has compassion on his children, so the Lord has compassion on those who fear him;

Psalm 34.18 (NIV11)

The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit.

See God as Father – who is as close
as the air on our skin

Hebrews 13.5 (NIV11)

Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said,
“Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you.”
