Consider how different this is from the normal way we use prayer... to get things. We may believe in God but our deepest hopes and happiness reside in things – as in how successful we are, or in our social relationships. We, therefore, pray mainly when our careers or finances are in trouble or when some relationship or social status is in jeopardy.

When life is going smoothly and our truest heart treasures seem safe, it doesn't occur to us to pray.. Seldom or never do we spend time in adoring or praising God... We know God is there, but we tend to see him as a means through which we get things to make us happy. For most of us, he has not become our happiness." Tim Keller

Ephesians 2.1 (NLT)

Once you were dead because of your disobedience and your many sins.

Romans 5.18-19 (NirV)

One man's sin brought guilt to all people. So also one right act made all people right with God. And all who are right with God will live. Many people were made sinners because one man did not obey. But one man did obey. That is why many people will be made right with God.

2Corinthians 5.21 (NIV11)

For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ.

Hebrews 13.12 (CEV)

Jesus himself suffered outside the city gate, so that his blood would make people holy.

1Corinthians 6.11 (NIRV)

Your sins were washed away. You were made holy. You were made right with God. All of that was done in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.

Romans 6.22 (NLT)

But now you are free from the power of sin and have become slaves of God. Now you do those things that lead to holiness and result in eternal life.

We have been set free from a curse

Galatians 3.10 (CEV)

Anyone who tries to please God by obeying the Law is under a curse. The Scriptures say, “Everyone who doesn’t obey everything in the Law is under a curse.”

Genesis 3.17-18 (NIV11)

To Adam he said, “Because you listened to your wife and ate fruit from the tree about which I commanded you, ‘You must not eat from it,’

“Cursed is the ground because of you; through painful toil you will eat food from it all the days of your life. It will produce thorns and thistles for you, and you will eat the plants of the field.”

Galatians 3.13-14 (CEV)

Christ set us free from the curse of the law. He did it by becoming a curse for us. It is written, “Everyone who is hung on a pole is under God’s curse.”

Christ Jesus set us free so that the blessing given to Abraham would come to Non-Jews through Christ. He did it so that we might receive the promise of the Holy Spirit by believing in Christ.

Romans 8:32 (NIV11)

He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all - how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?

Exodus 17.15 (NIV11)

Moses built an altar and called it The  
Lord is my Banner.

Isaiah 11.10 (NIV11)

In that day the Root of Jesse will stand as a banner for the peoples; the nations will rally to him, and his resting place will be glorious.

Colossians 2.15 (NIV11)

And having disarmed the powers and authorities, he made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross.

Romans 8.37-39 (NIV11)

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers,

neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

1Corinthians 15:55-56 (NIV11)

“Where, O death, is your victory?  
Where, O death, is your sting?”

The sting of death is sin, and the  
power of sin is the law. But thanks be  
to God! He gives us the victory  
through our Lord Jesus Christ.

2Timothy 1.10 (NirV)

He has destroyed death. Because of the good news, he has brought life out into the light. That life never dies.

Hebrews 2.14-15 (NIV11)

Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might break the power of him who holds the power of death - that is, the devil - and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death.

John 8.36 (NIV11)

So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.

Galatians 5.1 (NirV)

Christ has set us free. He wants us to enjoy freedom. So stand firm. Don't let the chains of slavery hold you again.

Psalm 34.1-3 (NLT)

I will praise the Lord at all times.

I will constantly speak his praises.

I will boast only in the Lord;

let all who are helpless take heart.
